





ARMY FAMILY TEAM BUILDING (AFTB)

Military life has unique issues and items that may cause some anxiety when transitioning from civilian life. Participate in an AFTB class to learn about life as an Army Family. Classes in English and Korean on subjects to improve and enhance quality of life for all Army Team Members.

DEPLOYMENT & MOBILIZATION (DM)/SSO

The program teaches soldiers, civilians and family members to prepare NEO packets properly; to compile and keep vital documents; proper maintenance and use of protective masks for adults and children; First Aid/CPR and more. Operation R.E.A.D.Y. materials, videos, and Family Readiness Group (FRG) training is available. Call to schedule individual or group training.

EMPLOYMENT READINESS PROGRAM (ERP)


ERP is here to help you with all your employment needs. We offer the following services: federal resume assistance (Resumix), career counseling, employment opportunities information, resume writing assistance and how to prepare and dress for an interview. You can get copies of federal employment forms, plus use of a computer/typewriter to complete required paperwork, and a small library of employment related books to check out.

EXCEPTIONAL FAMILY MEMBER PROGRAM (EFMP)

Camp Henry 768-8329

A mandatory enrollment program that provides special needs services (medical & educational) to family members who meet enrollment criteria. Sponsors enroll in the program and remain enrolled until separation from the service or current condition of the family member warrants case closure. Enrollment is updated every 3 years or when there is a significant change in the condition of the exceptional family member, whichever comes first. To enroll, please go to the nearest military treatment facility and ask for the EFMP POC or seek the assistance of the ACS EFMP Coordinator.



FINANCIAL READINESS PROGRAM (FRP)

Camp Henry 768-8127/Camp Carroll 765-8167/ Hialeah 763-7417

Services include financial management training in budget, savings, checkbook (remedial), investments, credit, banking, insurance and more. Call to schedule unit and individual training or for an appointment for personal counseling.



Army Emergency Relief (AER) provides financial assistance usually in the form of a no-interest loan, a grant (when appropriate), or a combination loan and grant. Types of emergencies covered are: non-receipt of pay; loss of funds; medical, dental and hospital expenses; funeral expenses for immediate family members; and travel expenses related to emergencies, rent, food, and utilities.

Personal Financial Management Training (PFMT) is mandatory for first term soldiers, but all ranks, spouses and civilians are welcome to attend. It covers the fundamentals of personal finance, budgeting, checking accounts and other banking services, credit, insurances, scams and rip-offs, investing (including TSP), and how to buy a car.

INFORMATION & REFERRAL (I&R)

ACS provides consolidated information on military and civilian resources and links soldiers, civilian employees, and their family members with available and appropriate resources.

In and Out Processing

Daily, 0800-1700. During in-processing, soldiers are scheduled for the Newcomers Orientation and Tour. Our staff is available to provide assistance in obtaining additional services required upon arrival. During out-processing, we verify that soldiers do not have any outstanding loans from our lending closet and ensure that all mandatory training is completed prior to PCS.

Lending Closet

Our lending closet is stocked with basic household goods items for use while your household goods are in transit. All items are available on a 30-day basis; however, loans may be extended as needed.

Newcomers Orientation and Windshield Tour

This monthly orientation consists of two sessions, a mandatory briefing and a tour.

Victim Advocacy screens victims of spouse/child abuse, evaluates their needs, and provides them with information about domestic violence. In addition, the victim advocate provides safe and confidential ways to seek assistance, information about their rights as spouses, and the resources and services available to them. Coordinates with the case manager in developing an appropriate plan of intervention which provides safety for the victim and family members. Call 768-8090.

Emergency Placement Care (EPC) Program, formerly known as Foster Care, provides temporary care for eligible children who cannot be cared for by their birth parents or legal guardian. Family Advocacy is providing free EPC Provider certification classes. If you are interested in becoming a certified EPC Provider or would like more information please call 768-8090.

Prevention Program


The intent of this program is to provide the community with the knowledge and tools needed to enhance the quality of family life and prevent any possible family violence from occurring. Classes available include Stress and Anger Management, Home Alone Training, Parenting Class, and Relationship Enrichment. New Parent Support Program (NPSP) is designed to strengthen parents' knowledge and skills so they can provide an environment where children can thrive. NPSP provides a Childbirth preparation Seminar, Breastfeeding Class, Parenting Class and Playgroup for parents who have 0-5 year-old children. NPSP also seeks to reduce stressors that can increase the risk of child abuse and neglect. Call 768-8091.

Army Education Center, Daegu Hub, Korea

Army Continuing Education System

The Area IV Education Centers offer a choice of two institutions for students working on post-secondary education at the Associate and Bachelor degree level. Both Central Texas College and the University of Maryland offer traditional classroom learning opportunities at all Area IV education centers.

Both UMC and CTC will evaluate a student's military experience and other documents indicating non-traditional learning experiences and, in most cases, will award some college credit for those experiences. In order to receive such an evaluation, a student must complete at least six semester hours with that institution. Upon completion of the residency requirements (usually ¼ of total degree requirements), a student can establish a Servicemember's Opportunity College Army Degree (SOCAD) agreement with the school to ensure he/she will receive a degree upon completion of all other degree requirements. Once a student meets residency requirements and completes certain required courses, he or she may take the remaining required courses at other accredited institutions and transfer those credits back to the institution to apply towards the degree. For more information, contact your education center.

A student enrolling with UMUC or CTC must be a graduate of an accredited high school or have a GED equivalency certificate.

Transfer credit from accredited colleges and universities may be accepted when the grade earned was "C" or better and the course applies to the student's curriculum.

Courses are offered during five academic terms per year. Each term is eight weeks long. Classes are conducted during traditional "off-duty" hours. Class times include noontime, evenings and weekends.

Specific information on the two educational institutions are listed below:

Central Texas College (CTC) is a two year, open admissions institution which provides educational opportunities to our community. CTC offers vocational, technical, or academic courses leading to certification or associate degrees.

Programs of study vary with each location. Within the 20th Support Group Area IV, Law Enforcement, Microcomputer Technology, and Management degrees are popular. For a schedule of courses to be conducted this term, as well as throughout the year, contact the Education Services Specialist or CTC representative at your installation.

University of Maryland University College offers a range of courses leading to a certificate, associate degree, or bachelor's degree. Programs of study vary with each location. Within the 20th Support Group Area IV, the following subject areas are offered:


Communication Skills (English/Speech), Social Sciences, Arts and Humanities, Mathematics, Natural Sciences, Computer Science, and Business and Management. For a schedule of courses to be conducted this term, as well as throughout the year, contact the Education Services Specialist or UMUC representative at your installation.

Important Information For All Soldiers Using Army Tuition Assistance

In accordance with Army Regulation AR 621-5 (Army Continuing Education System) dated 27 February 2004, all soldiers are required to have a Service Members Opportunity College Army Degree (SOCAD) Plan or an Official Evaluation from their institution in order to receive Tuition Assistance (TA) for any college level class beyond nine semester hours. If a soldier has requested the official evaluation but it has not yet been completed by the school, the soldier will still be allowed to continue use of TA. This policy will be strictly adhered to at all Area IV Army Education Centers.


Additionally, soldiers who have completed at least 15 semester hours of college credit will be required to have a minimum of 2.0 (on 4.0 scale) Grade Point Average (GPA) to be eligible for use of TA. Any soldier with at least fifteen semester hours who has a GPA less than 2.0, may continue to take classes if the college academic policies allow, but will have to use other means of payment until the GPA is raised to at least 2.0.

Current Army policy allows for payment of 100% of the tuition costs (with a cap of \$250 per semester hour and an annual cap of \$4500) for any college course which a soldier takes as long as that course applies to a degree above that is currently held. Exceptions are that no TA is authorized for doctorate programs and any soldier may receive TA for a college level host nation language course from an accredited college or university. This means that any soldier, regardless of the degree currently held, may use TA for approved college level Korean language courses. Spouses Urged to Speak Their Mind Through Army-wide Survey

Alexandria, Va. – Don't say the "cat got your tongue." It will be clear that "the bark stops here" as Army spouses will be urged to speak their minds when the 2004 Survey of Army Families V arrives in selected mailboxes in early September.

These and other catchy phrases will soon be seen in the Area IV community, adorning brightly imprinted kids and adults T-shirts, balloons, commissary bags and more to boost awareness of the critical importance of the survey to Army families.

The Survey of Army Families is mailed directly to spouses in randomly selected Army households around the world every four years. The survey generates Army-wide data on spouse attitudes about the Army way of life, including housing; relocation; paid and volunteer work; children; health care; morale, welfare and recreation; deployments and other issues.

The survey is a key source of information from spouses that directly reaches senior Army leadership. Survey results lead directly to changes in family-focused programs and services to improve life for Army families, based upon what spouses indicate are the most important to them.

About 60,000 families will be included in the random sampling for the 2004 survey—that means a spouse has about a one-in-four chance in receiving a survey. The greater the response rate, the more helpful the information is in guiding the Army in fine-tuning the programs that serve Army families. This makes it critical that every recipient of a survey takes the time to complete it; this year, survey participants will also have the option of completing the survey online.

Beginning in September, look for a bright neon-green 9x12 envelope in the mail marked "2004 Survey of Army Families." If selected to participate, you represent Army spouses who are your friends and neighbors in your community, as well as spouses around the world. Taking advantage of this opportunity to voice your opinion through the Survey of Army Families is vital to representing and communicating the concerns of today's Army spouses.

The Survey of Army Families began in 1987 as a direct response to concerns that the Army was unresponsive to the challenges facing military spouses and other family members. Thanks to the input from thousands of spouses in prior surveys, today's Army families enjoy an enhanced quality of life. For example, Congress approved an aggressive program that is

privatizing and dramatically raising the standards for military housing. Army spouses are also benefiting from the outcomes generated by an employment summit conducted in 2002 in partnership with Fortune 500 companies with the goal of increasing corporate job opportunities for Army spouses and helping them build skills attractive to business.

The Survey of Army Families is conducted by the U.S. Army Community and Family Support Center in Alexandria, Va., the Army field operating agency which provides Army Welfare and
